# EuroWindoor Conference 2012 -"Climate Protection with new Windows"



EuroWindoor is the organizer of the conference on "Climate Protection with new Windows" on March 21<sup>rd</sup>, 2012 in Nuremberg. ## **EuroWindoor meeting with EC DG Enterprise**

EuroWindoor met Mr Vincente Leoz-Argüelles, Head of Unit Construction, DG Enterprise on

October 18<sup>th</sup> in Brussels. The intention of the meeting was to discuss on the Construction Products Regulation (CPR) and Eco Design Directive which causes Energy labelling and Eco-Labelling.

Mr Leoz pointed out that it is not possible for the member states to implement CPR in different ways: the CPR rules have to be fulfilled. This is different to CPD where a differentiation was possible. There is an exception to this rule. In the CPR a different implementation between Member States is possible in one case: the designation of the notified bodies. Member states may choose to do that via a compulsory accreditation or directly against the criteria of Art. 43. The European Commission prefers accreditation and thinks that this will be the case of the majority in the EU member states.

The timetable for implementing the CPR for manufacturers allows time until July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013. After this date the full CPR is mandatory and for example the *declaration of performance* will become compulsory.

Mr Leoz pointed out that associations may contribute to the implementation of the CPR by acting as a contact point for manufacturers. It is evident that a lot of additional information is necessary for them to become prepared until the deadline.

EuroWindoor offered to stay in touch with DG Enterprise and to contribute with its possibilities to ensure a smooth implementation of the CPR.

Also a better coordination of CE marking, Energy labelling and Eco-Labelling was requested. It was stated that industry is in favour of CE marking and the declared values must be the basis for additional requirements.



## **EuroWindoor meeting with DG Environment**

On October 18<sup>th</sup> another meeting took place with DG Environment. Participants from EuroWindoor had met with this DG before and were happy to meet again the Head of Unit Mr Pavel Misiga and the Policy Officers Mrs Alenka Burja and Mrs Josephina Lindblom.

A discussion started on the concerns of many manufacturers about additional burdens coming from CE marking and the plans for Ecodesign and Ecolabel measures. Mr Misiga pointed out that the European Commission by no means wants to install more pressure on the fenestration industry, especially as it is dominated by SMEs. But the construction sector is very important within the EU and thus a key sector for policies. On the other hand, in general more bureaucracy is created when European rules are transformed into national rules.

There is a strong relation between windows, buildings and environment.

The Commission is pushing in this direction: Strong requirements for buildings will gain demand for fenestration products. Ecolabel and Ecodesign are seen as a complimentary instrument to differentiate between products. The Commission is now exploring with JRC from Seville how criteria can be set. EuroWindoor agrees to participate as stakeholder to the study delivering data from the industry. The preliminary study shall be ready by early 2012 and another meeting between the DG Environment and EuroWindoor will be held then to discuss the results.

EuroWindoor stated that industry needs more time to implement new rules. We are in favour of CE marking, but many countries are still not finished with implementation. Additional labelling struggle especially SME unnecessary. All requirements should be implemented in one label, e.g. the CE marking.
